Guy Percy Codrington-Forsyth was born at Walthamstow, Essex, England and attended London College and Holloway, London N, England. Guy arrived in Australia aged 19, and attended HAC 1913-1914 where he undertook special courses in orchards and plots.

Guy was working on the Bathurst Experimental Farm, Bathurst, NSW when he enlisted on 30 June 1915.

Codrington-Forsyth joined the 20th Battalion, 4th Reinforcement and embarked from Sydney, on board HMAT A8 *Argyllshire* on 30 September 1915.

Guy served at Gallipoli and then went on to France June 1916.

Appointed 2nd Lieutenant on 28 October 1916, and then to Lieutenant with the 48th Battalion on 8 March 1917. Guy was Killed in Action on 11 April 1917 at Bullecourt, France, aged 23 years old.

Codrington-Forsyth has no known grave and is commemorated on the Australian National Memorial Villers-Bretonneux, Villers-Bretonneux, France.
